Connectivity – 4G Data uplift

Mr Endacott has put information out to all pupils via SMHW about requesting additional 4G data from the mobile networks. We have been surprised by how few requests we have received about the data uplift. If you think that your son/daughter is eligible please can I encourage you to complete the form via the link included here Data uplift form

Connectivity

Some mobile providers are now offering extra data for free to children to enable them to work remotely via the 4G connection on their smartphone. They could hotspot a laptop to their phone or watch the videos on their phone.

Who is eligible for a 4G data uplift?

Students who don't have a reliable, fixed broadband connection at home. If students cannot afford the extra data needed to access lessons, resources. If students/parents have a smartphone connected to EE, Tesco Mobile, Smarty, O2, Three or Virgin (other providers may be added in due course).

How do students sign-up

Complete the form on SMHW and we submit all requests on behalf of students. These can take up to 14 days to be processed but should be quicker in most cases. Data uplift form

Feedback and assessment

Some parents have contacted us to ask about the frequency of teacher feedback and comments on their son/daughter's work. The vast majority of pupils are submitting the quiz answers via SMHW after each lesson. This enables teachers to assess the learning from each lesson and plan the appropriate next steps. Teachers can also use this information to contact particular students or groups of students within the class who have done particularly well, or who may need to get more support with some aspects of the lesson. The opportunity to improve pieces of assessed work following teacher feedback will be provided within the recorded lessons. Pupils will know this activity as adding "green pen" or completing a "DIRT" activity. If a pupil sends an email or question to a member of staff we aim to get a reply back on that day or at least within 24 hours.

Clearly, in this time of home learning, feedback will not be as instantaneous or as frequent as it can be within the classroom and we are constantly looking for additional ways that we can maintain contact with pupils and provide regular ongoing feedback and guidance.

Show My Homework - FAQs

We are continuing to use SMHW (Satchel One) as our main vehicle for communicating remote teaching and learning to all of our pupils. There is a FAQ section within SMHW which may provide some additional information or support if you have any questions about the platform. The intention is not to disturb valuable family time and we do apologise for any inconvenience that this may cause to you or your son/daughter. Please may I suggest that you ask your son/daughter to get into a routine of turning off their push notifications at the end of the school day and to turn them on again the following morning.

Free School Meal Vouchers from week beginning 25 January

Thank you for collecting your hampers from the Academy over the past few weeks. I hope that you have found the contents helpful. From this Monday 25 January, we will be moving to using the National Food Voucher Scheme. This means that you will receive a £15 gift voucher per week per eligible child until February half term. These vouchers will be e-mailed to you directly from Edenred, the company who runs the scheme for the Government.

If your child is in school for face-to-face learning you will not receive a voucher, as they will be able to continue to receive a free school meal at lunchtime. If you receive a voucher, and your child returns to the Academy during that week, please can you send them in with a packed lunch. We will then update the list of vouchers so you do not receive them while your child is in the Academy. During February half-term the voucher will be sent directly to all eligible families from Derbyshire County Council as part of the Winter Food Scheme. Again, further details are available from the Academy website. We do not know if the National Food Voucher Scheme will be extended after half-term as it is not yet known when schools will fully reopen; we will let you know as soon as we can. Please note that once the vouchers have been redeemed there is nothing that the Academy can do to support you in using them; all queries need to go to either Edenred or the supermarket you have chosen.




Reading update

Oak National Academy - free access library




